CHAPTER I: SCOPE – NATURE OF THE FELLOWSHIP

Article 1

The rules and regulations hereinafter are only applicable to holders of a Postdoctoral Researcher (CR - Chargé de recherches) fellowship of the Fund for Scientific Research – FNRS (F.R.S.-FNRS).

CR applications must be submitted under Grants and Fellowships Call of the Fund for Scientific Research - FNRS (F.R.S.-FNRS).

Article 2

Holders of a Postdoctoral Researcher (CR - Chargé de recherches) fellowship shall carry out a Postdoctoral-level research work in a university of the French-speaking Community of Belgium under the supervision of a promoter and a postdoctoral co-promoter (if any) from one of the institutions listed in Appendix 1.

The promoter must meet the following conditions altogether:

- Be permanently appointed¹ to an academic or scientific position or on probation in that university.
- This appointment must have a final and conclusive assent from the competent body to legitimize this appointment in accordance with the Law or the university regulations by the time of the validation deadline set for the academic authorities (rectors) at the latest.
- This academic or scientific position must be effective by the time of the starting date of the fellowship, i.e., by 1st October of the year of the Grants and Fellowships Call concerned at the latest.

If the promoter of a CR applicant who is appointed permanently accesses the legal age of retirement / becomes professor emeritus after the validation deadline set for the academic authorities (rectors) and before the end of the funding scheme in case of granting, the submission of the application shall be subject to prior approval by the Head of institution where the research will be carried out.

The promoter permanently appointed who will access the legal age of retirement / become professor emeritus by the validation deadline set for the academic authorities (rectors) is not eligible.

CHAPTER II: APPLICATION

Article 3

Applicants to a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship must have obtained the academic degree of Doctor after the defence of a thesis and issued by an academic institution at the latest by 1st May of the year during which the application is submitted.

A copy of the PhD diploma, or a certificate of achievement if you have not been delivered your diploma yet, must be enclosed in the application file or sent to the F.R.S.-FNRS by 1st May the year when the application is submitted at the latest.

Article 4

Applicants to a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship must have obtained the academic degree as referred to in Article 3 for maximum 5 years. This term shall expire at the latest on the validation deadline set for the academic authorities (rectors) to validate applications.

The maximum period of time set in paragraph 1 is extended for one additional year per childbirth and/or adoption.

Article 5

No applicant may apply more than three times for the same fellowship. Applicants who have already benefited from a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship, regardless of the duration, may not apply either.

Article 6

The Grants and Fellowships Call is opened once a year and is published on the F.R.S.-FNRS website.

The application can be submitted in French or in English. It must only be submitted on [e-space](#), the online platform dedicated to the calls for proposals.

It is recommended to applicants who wish to have their application file assessed by [Scientific Commissions](#) dedicated to SEN (Exact and Natural Sciences) and SVS (Health and Life Sciences) fields, as well as the Scientific Commission SHS-2, to submit their application in English².

All applications are submitted to a procedure including three successive electronic validations on the dates that will be indicated when the call is published:

- a. The validation by the applicant: it accounts as a confirmation that the application file is complete.
- b. The validation by the promoter selected pursuant to article 2: the F.R.S.-FNRS transfers the application file to promoters so that they give their approval for the submitted research project and confirm the accuracy of the data provided by the applicant. The promoter may accept or refuse the application.
- c. The validation by the research administration (or Board of Education) of the university of the French-speaking Community of Belgium, to which the application file is transferred once promoters have given their consent. The academic authority may accept or refuse the application. The validation deadline set for the rectors puts a final end to the call for proposals.

Applications that have not been validated within the time-frame of the call cannot be taken into account.

A mini-guide specifies the validation dates as well as the documents which must be included in the application.

CHAPTER III: ALLOCATION AND DURATION OF THE FELLOWSHIP

Article 7

The Board of Trustees of the F.R.S.-FNRS shall decide on the allocation of Postdoctoral Researcher fellowships.

Article 8

The allocation of a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship leads to a fixed-term contract of three years between the F.R.S.-FNRS and the fellowship holder.

Holders of a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship may use the 3 years of their fellowship over a period of 6 years if an external funding is obtained in order to carry out a postdoctoral research outside the French-speaking Community of Belgium.

CHAPTER IV: RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE FELLOWSHIP HOLDERS

Article 9

Any research project being funded must observe statutory provisions in force governing ethics.

Article 10

Postdoctoral Researchers are subordinated to the Board of Trustees of the F.R.S.-FNRS, which acts through its President and General Secretary. They pledge to respect the rules and regulations in force within the Fund.

They must respect the discipline enforced by the academic authority of the institution where they work and observe its rules and regulations. As Research Fellows of the F.R.S.-FNRS, they are also required to adhere to the regulation on the property, protection and promotion of the results from the research carried out within the institution.

Article 11

Postdoctoral Researchers may not change the object of their research without the F.R.S.-FNRS authorisation.

Article 12

Postdoctoral Researchers may attend classes, supervise practical sessions or perform administrative tasks; however, they cannot devote more than eight hours per week to those activities. One hour dedicated to supervising practical sessions is equivalent to two hours dedicated to performing administrative tasks or two hours dedicated to attending classes.

Within the specified time frame of eight hours, they can also perform teaching tasks, which may not exceed two hours per week (60 hours per year). In this case, the F.R.S.-FNRS allows them to accept remuneration related to their teaching position providing that the amount of that remuneration and their remuneration as Postdoctoral Researchers do not exceed the salary of a university lecturer. They can bear the title related to their teaching activities.

Article 13

Except for the provisions in article 12, holders of a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship may not be part of the scientific or academic staff of a university or an academic institution, and may not receive any remuneration or salary.

However, the F.R.S.-FNRS may upon request authorise them to receive full or part of the allowances that they may be entitled to have for research stays abroad.

Article 14

Holders of a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship receive an operating credit.

That credit can only be allocated if the holder genuinely carries out the fellowship.

Article 15

At the end of each academic year, holders of a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship are required to send to the F.R.S.-FNRS a report on the scientific activities they have carried out along the year. This report is to be uploaded on their personal [e-space](#) page. The holders of a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship must also send a copy to the Head of the institution where they carry out their research.

Article 16

Holders of a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship shall mention in their publications, papers and reprinted/e-print alike that they have been Postdoctoral Researchers of the F.R.S.-FNRS.

Article 17

Holders of a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship who wish to study or pursue their research abroad must give prior notice to the F.R.S.-FNRS on their personal [e-space](#) page at least 15 days before the actual date of departure.

For any stay, a prior agreement of the promoter must be sent to the F.R.S.-FNRS and uploaded on e-space.

In case of a long-term stay (90 days and more), an agreement of the Head of the institution where the Postdoctoral Researcher carries out their research must also be submitted to the F.R.S.-FNRS on e-space by the institution.

Article 18

Any change regarding the civil status, the family responsibility, the domicile or residence must be reported by the holder of a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship on their personal [e-space](#) page, as soon as possible.

Article 19

Holders of a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship shall inform the F.R.S.-FNRS of any temporary interruption or suspension of work as soon as they can and for any reason whatsoever.

Article 20

In case of illness or personal accident, a medical certificate attesting the starting date and the duration or extension of a period of professional incapacity must be submitted to the F.R.S.-FNRS within 48 hours following the beginning of the incapacity period. The promoter shall send a copy of the medical certificate to the relevant department of the institution where the Postdoctoral Researcher carries out their research.

Article 21

In case of work accident, the administrative staff of the F.R.S.-FNRS must be informed within 24 hours, by phone if necessary. The declaration of accident as well as the medical certificate reporting the accident must be sent to the Fund. The health department of the institution where the Postdoctoral Researcher carries out their research must be informed as well.

CHAPTER V: INTERRUPTIONS

Article 22

The Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship interrupted due to a maternity, paternity or adoption leave can be extended for a duration equivalent to the duration of the interruption.

The extension request must be made at least one month before the fellowship expires. The granting of this extension does not adversely affect the fixed-term nature of the fellowship.

Article 23

The Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship interrupted for a period of one month or more due to illness shall be extended over a period equal to the period of interruption.

Extension will be granted upon receipt of a medical certificate justifying the work incapacity for a period of one month or more.

The extension of the Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship will be effective when the researcher returns to work, by signing a formal contract amendment stating the new ending date of the fellowship. The researcher will be required to send it to the F.R.S.-FNRS for approval.

CHAPTER VI: FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

Article 24

Financial and social provisions are governed by specific rules and regulations.

CHAPTER VII: FINAL PROVISION

Article 25

Holders of a Postdoctoral Researcher fellowship may terminate their fellowship agreement at any time. They shall give a written notice of their decision to the F.R.S.-FNRS, their promoter and the Head of the institution where they have carried out their research programme.
