

2024 Eugène Yourassowsky Award in medical microbiology and infectious diseases

REGULATIONS



- Art. 1. Thanks to the generous patronage of a private donator, the Fund for Scientific Research-FNRS (F.R.S.-FNRS) will grant the **2024 Eugène Yourassowsky Award** in recognition of an outstanding PhD thesis that presents an original contribution in the field of **medical microbiology and infectious diseases**.
- Art. 2. The following eligibility criteria apply to the applications:
 - The PhD thesis must have **been publicly defended between 1st January 2020 and 31st December 2023 in a university of the Federation Wallonia-Brussels**.
 - The PhD thesis may not have been previously rewarded, except by an honorary Award.
- Art. 3. The Award amounts to **15.000 €**. Half of this amount will be awarded to the laureate for personal use; the other half will be allocated to the laureate's laboratory in the Federation Wallonia-Brussels where the PhD thesis was conducted.
- Art. 4. Applications, written in English, must be submitted via e-mail, with the following documents to prix@frs-fnrs.be **by March 4, 2024, 23:59 (Brussels time) at the latest**:
 - the application form duly completed and signed,
 - a detailed curriculum vitae,
 - a complete list of publications,
 - an electronic version of the thesis.

The regulations and application form are available on the website www.frs-fnrs.be.

- Art. 5. The Award will be granted on basis of the recommendation of an independent Jury of experts appointed by the FNRS.
- Art. 6. The Award cannot be divided between several candidates.
- Art. 7. If no suitable candidate can be identified, the Jury can decide not to grant the Award.
- Art. 8. Any issue regarding the eligibility of the applications or the granting of the Award will be settled in a final and binding manner by the FNRS.
- Art. 9. The scientific outlines, presentations and evaluation reports generated in the framework of the **2024 Eugène Yourassowsky Award** will be treated confidentially.
